We received so many personal hygiene items for the Open Door day shelter in Eustis that we were able to donate five full boxes. The people who visit the shelter for showers, laundry. food, counseling, and computer access were thrilled. (Open Door helps an average of 53 people every day. One success story is a vet-

eran who was homeless. The staff helped him restart his veterans benefits. which allowed him to use the back pay for a house down payment. He reunited with his daughters and met his grandchildren for the first time)



Rotating the Biblical Rite of Anointing with Oil

Previously the Rite of Anointing with Oil has been offered only at 8am worship on Communion Sundays. Starting this month, the rite will instead be rotated between services each Communion Sunday as follows:

• December: 9:30am Service

January:11am Service

• February: 8am Service

• And so on.

Those who wish to receive the rite can do so before or after the sacrament. Proceed via the side aisles to the anointing station at center back of the nave. Once you have received the rite, you may return to your seat via the center aisle. If you are not physically able to go to the station, tell a communion server and we will come to you.
